REGARDLESS OF THEIR ABILITY

This concept should be clear and foremost in the minds of all adult supervisors.

All boys will be given a fair go. Over the duration of the season they will bat at various stages of the innings. They will bowl about the same number of overs and share the wicket keeping around but without the sharing of equipment.

Players Code of Conduct

- \cdot Play by the rules.
- Never argue with an umpire. If you disagree, have your captain, coach or manager approach the umpire during a break or after the game.
- Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials and sledging other player deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent are not acceptable or permitted behaviours in Cricket.
- Work equally hard for yourself and your teammates. Your team's performance will benefit and so will you.
- \cdot Be a good sport. Applaud all good plays whether they are made by your team or the opposition.
- \cdot Treat all participants in Cricket as you like to be treated. Do not bully or take unfair advantage of another competitor.
- Cooperate with your coach, teammates and opponents. Without them there would be no competition.
- Participate for your own enjoyment and benefit, not just to please parents and coaches. Make sure you support your teammates and don't muck around in the grounds where you play.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

Parents Code of Behaviour

- Do not force an unwilling child to participate in Cricket. It can be very frustrating to coaches.
- Remember, children are involved in Cricket for their enjoyment, not yours.
- Encourage your child to play by the rules.
- Focus on the child's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing.
- Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a game.
- Remember that children learn best by example.
- Appreciate good performances by all participants.
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.
- Respect officials' decisions and teach children to do likewise.
- Show appreciation for volunteer coaches, officials and administrators. Without them, your child could not participate.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

TRAINING
